HOW WE PROTECT YOU

- ✓ **Encrypted connections**
All traffic is served over enforced HTTPS with modern browser security headers.
- ✓ **Protected data**
Account data is accessed through safeguarded methods that block common attacks.
- ✓ **Ownership checks**
Downloads and unlockables confirm true on-chain ownership at the moment of access.
- ✓ **Controlled access**
Administrative actions require a securely verified session with strict checks.
- ✓ **Verified payments**
Every purchase is confirmed directly on the blockchain before anything is delivered.
- ✓ **Guarded credentials**
Sensitive keys stay strictly server-side and are never exposed to the browser.
- ✓ **Abuse prevention**
Rate limits shield public features from spam and automated misuse.
- ✓ **Validated inputs**
Uploads and form entries are checked for type, size, and format before processing.
